## Secondary Schools Learning Model Information

<b>How long will this registration be in place for?</b>	Your student will remain in the chosen learning model for the entire first semester. We will prepare a second registration process for the second semester, if necessary, depending on the status of the COVID-19 pandemic.
<b>Will every course and program be offered in each model?</b>	Some programs and courses may not be available in each model as school schedules and classes are created based on student requests. As is true every year at the high school level, students will get their course schedule before school begins and will have the opportunity to work with school staff to adjust programs and courses that meet their post-secondary goals, provided there is availability.

<b>Will students be able to participate in sports and extracurricular activities in each model?</b>	When CIF allows high school sports to resume, students in both models will be able to participate. When county health orders allow extracurricular activities to resume, middle and high school students in both models will be able to participate.
<b>If my student is in Vista Classic, when health orders allow students to return to campus, will my student stay with their same schedule and teachers?</b>	Yes. That is one of the reasons why we are doing an early registration, even if county health orders prohibit us from in person learning. Students will receive their class schedule for the entire semester. Their schedules will remain the same, as will their teachers and the students in their classes, whether we are on campus or in a distance learning environment.
<b>Is my high school student allowed to take courses at a local community college?</b>	Yes. High school students are still allowed to enroll in courses at local community colleges. School counseling staff can assist students with these requests, based on district policy.
<b>When health orders allow us to return to campus, what health procedures will be in place for the Vista Classic Model?</b>	For the Vista Classic model, students will be required to follow a robust set of health and safety measures while on campus. These measures include wearing an appropriate face covering, observing social distancing as practicable, following health check guidelines, and observing other procedures as required by the county health orders.

<b>My student receives special education services. What should I be considering?</b>	Regardless of the model you choose, your IEP teams will convene to ensure that your student will have the appropriate support and services to access the learning model and receive Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE). If you choose the Vista Virtual learning model, all IEP services to include related services (e.g., speech therapy, counseling, occupational therapy, etc.) will be provided via live virtual instruction. This approach may not be best for some students who have more intensive special education needs. If you choose the Vista Classic learning model, it is important to note that we cannot provide this model until the county health and safety orders are lifted.
